We have had a busy week for half term with lots of opportunities for the community to enjoy the Estate.

On the Monday 'Write Night' community writing group joined us in the dark to find inspiration for their writing. Jan Williams, author of 'The Ghost of Pendlesham Priory' read from her book in the Chapel. The story was about a ghost in the ruins of a deserted convent. The ghost communicates through a boy to tell her story of suffering during the Dissolution of the Monasteries. On Tuesday Home-Start Tendring joined us for some Halloween fun for the families they work with, including crafts and hot dogs!





Wednesday was our family photography workshop. Led by local photographer Becky, families learnt tips and techniques to use their smartphones or cameras to get the best pictures of their children. We couldn't have asked for better weather and the feedback from the staff and students was brilliant and such an encouragement to the team.



#### **Owl Pellets**

We are fortunate enough to have a connection with a local owl expert and licenced ringer in the area. He provided us with a large amount of owl pellets which we have used this month with our Young Carers group and the Home Educating families. It was fascinating to be able to pick them apart and identify the owls' dinner from the skulls and bones contained within. We were surprised that nearly all those who took part wanted to take the bones they found home with them! The Young Carers project is a fantastic link between the Education Centre and the local school and following our session on Owls we had the idea to strengthen the connection by having twin owl boxes installed at each site.
